Ms. Paczkowski presented the Board with a summary of how many City employees, both Uniformed and General Government, who will be eligible to retire within the next 3 years.

Kessler Topaz Meltzer & Check contract

Ms. Paczkowski provided information on the historical background for the System's agreement with Kessler Topaz Meltzer & Check (KTMC) for securities litigation monitoring and class action claims filings. KTMC has requested a modification to the agreement to provide for a 4% fee for any funds recovered for claims that KTMC filed on behalf of the Pension System. Ms. Paczkowski intends to issue an RFP for securities litigation monitoring and claims filing services, but she asked the Board to approve the contract addendum with KTMC so that claims monitoring services will continue while the Board evaluates its options.
