Investment Guideline Update – Eagle

Ms. Paczkowski presented proposed updated guidelines for Eagle Capital Management, LLC. to the Board. Currently, Eagle is one of four domestic equity managers engaged by the System. The revised guidelines are intended to slightly increase Eagle's investment flexibility while maintaining appropriate Board oversight and control.

Ms. Fugate made a motion to approve the updated guidelines for Eagle Capital Management. Ms. Munroe Ward seconded the motion. The motion passed 9-0.

Ms. Savannah Kirk inquired about General Government employees and their use of the Delayed Retirement Option Program (DROP). A brief discussion followed regarding the use of the DROP and how Plan H doesn't have the DROP as an option, which provided useful information to the Board.
